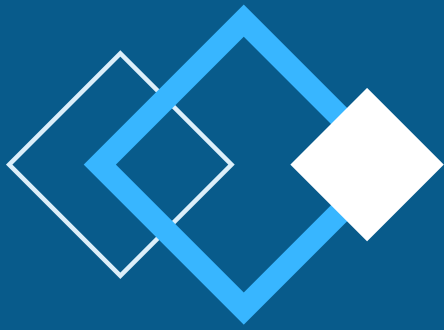


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FOREWORD

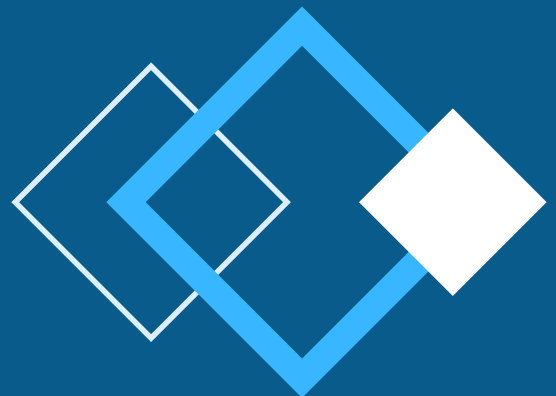
From the Founder's Desk

Classrooms of Hope – Coaching Center Opens in Pithoragarh

In the remote village of Mankatiya, Pithoragarh, June 2, 2024 marked a turning point for students dreaming of a better tomorrow. With the launch of its second Excellence Coaching Center, the Samoon Foundation opened doors to free education, tailored for high-potential students facing financial barriers.

The center was inaugurated in a wave of community pride, with Chief Guest Mr. Mahesh Punetha praising the initiative's role in breaking the cycle of educational inequality. But the most powerful voices came from the students themselves—grateful, determined, and ready to rewrite their futures. Their joy and ambition transformed the event into more than a ceremony—it became a promise. With continued community support, this coaching center stands as a symbol of equity, where every child's dreams are given the wings to soar.



Uniforms That Level the Field – Phase 1 Begins in Muni Ki Reti

On 5 July 2024, Swami Shivanand Memorial Primary School buzzed with excitement as the Samoon Foundation kicked off the first phase of its uniform campaign. Sports kits slipped over eager shoulders, doing far more than covering clothes: they erased visible divides, lifted confidence, and reminded students that achievement—not income—sets them apart. Headmistress Rajni Mangai thanked the team, noting that each gifted uniform lightened a family's financial load while brightening a child's dream. Backed by volunteers and staff, Samoon's drive aims to reach 2,000 high-achieving but cash-strapped pupils, proving that equality can start with something as simple as a matching jersey.

Parents, teachers, and Samoon volunteers stood side-by-side, celebrating a shared belief: classrooms thrive when clothing no longer betrays hardship. The initiative at Tikhon marked another meaningful step toward removing barriers in rural education—one school, one student at a time.



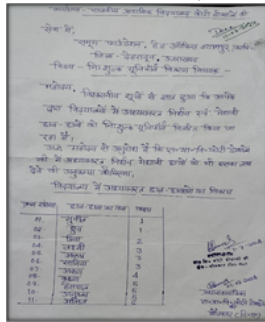
A Week of Dedication – Samoon Foundation Brings Uniforms to Koti Dobhalon Ki

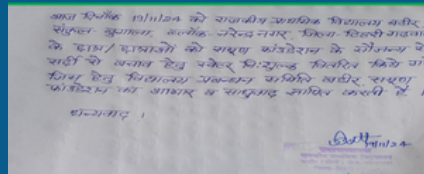


Double Impact — Samoon Foundation Returns to Badir with Winter Support

With each visit, the Samoon Foundation strengthens its holistic model—where educational equity is supported through consistent, need-based care.

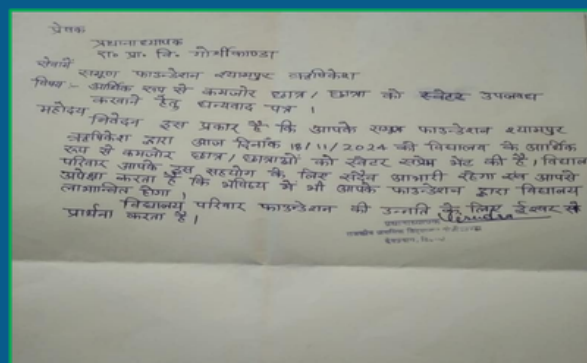


Winter Warmth for Learning — Sweaters Reach Gorthi Kanda Students

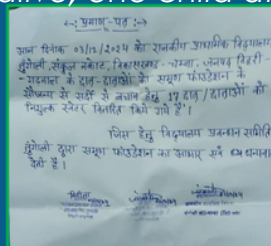

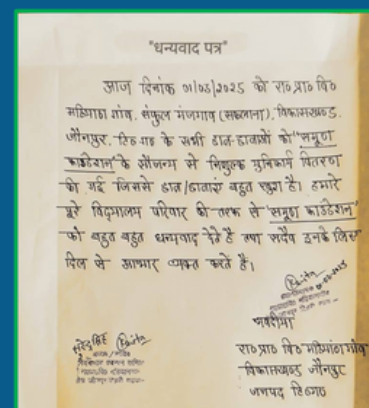

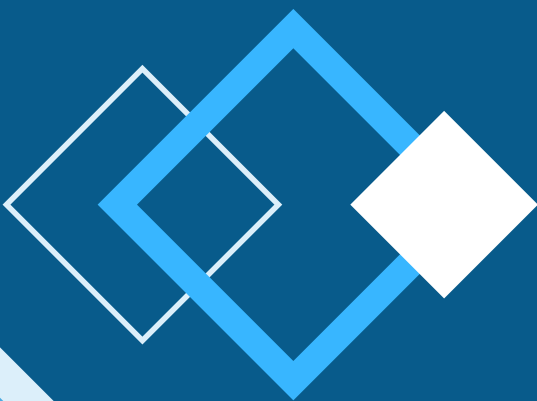
Purwala: Beyond Uniforms, Building Futures

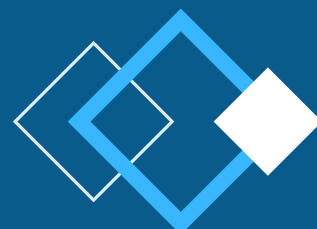

Spreading Light — Samoon Foundation Shares Diwali Cheer with Rishikesh's Needy

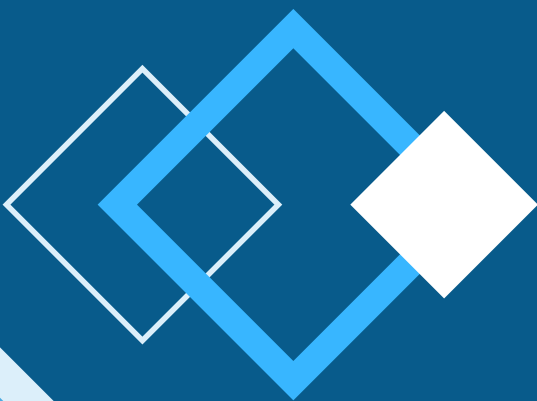

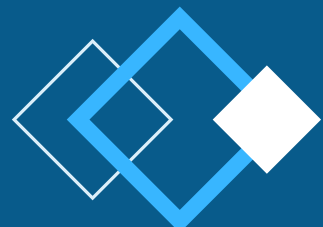

A Bright Beginning — Prachi's Navodaya Dream Comes True

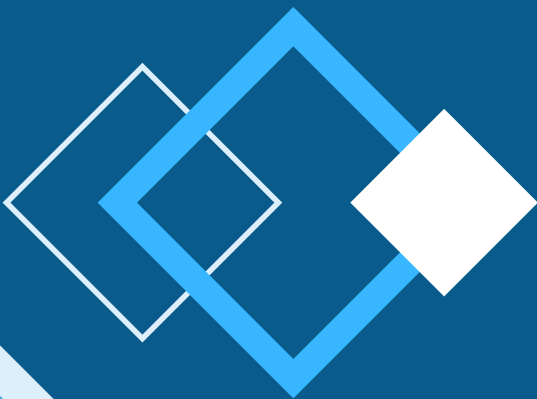

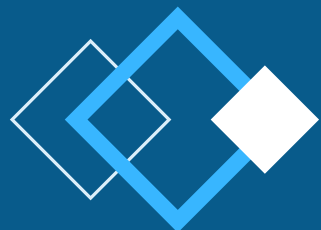

When it came time for Gauri's wedding in April 2024, her uncle turned once again to the Foundation. The response was swift and full of heart. Donors like Lakshan Singh Butola and Hemant Nayal came together, enabling the Foundation to gift essential wedding items worth ₹35,000. But beyond the gifts, Gauri walked into her new life wrapped in a community's love. Her story is a gentle testament to how compassion can turn sorrow into celebration, and how hope often arrives in the arms of many.



Viral Grief to Grounded Help – A Nonagenarian's Rescue

When a heartbreaking video of a 93-year-old woman begging for food went viral, it stirred emotions across the internet. But for the Samoon Foundation, it stirred action. On discovering her story, the team quickly reached out to learn more—and found layers of tragedy: she lived with her widowed daughter, cared for two orphaned great-grandchildren, and had been forced onto the streets due to poverty and a recent injury in the family.

On May 10, 2024, the Foundation visited their home. Though the injured child had recovered, the household was still in deep need. The team delivered a month's supply of groceries—offering not just food, but a return to dignity for the elderly woman. This moment reminded everyone that even behind a fleeting viral clip, real lives hang in the balance—and with empathy and swift action, real change is possible.



A Gift of Warmth – Clothing Drive Brings Comfort in Rishikesh

As monsoon rains approached Rishikesh on June 24, 2024, the Samoon Foundation brought comfort and care to those in need. Through its Annual Clothing Distribution Campaign, over 200 garments—shirts, t-shirts, and kurtas—were shared with underprivileged individuals, easing seasonal hardships with warmth and dignity.

Guided by the belief that every small act matters, Founder Vinod Jethudi reminded all, “We may not be able to help everyone, but we can certainly try to help some.” This annual drive, run with compassion and commitment, reflected more than charity—it was a gesture of humanity. In each folded shirt lay a quiet message of solidarity, proving once again that hope can be stitched together, one person at a time.



Warmth in the Wake of Disaster — Samoon Foundation Aids Tilgarh Flood Victims

In August 2024, the serene village of Tilgarh in Uttarakhand was devastated by sudden landslides and floods. Dozens of families were displaced, and many children found themselves without shelter or warm clothing.

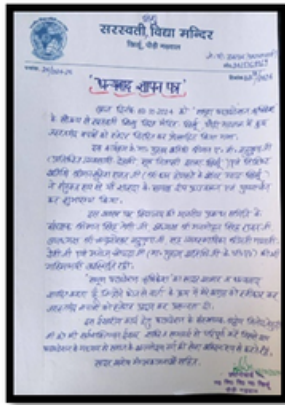

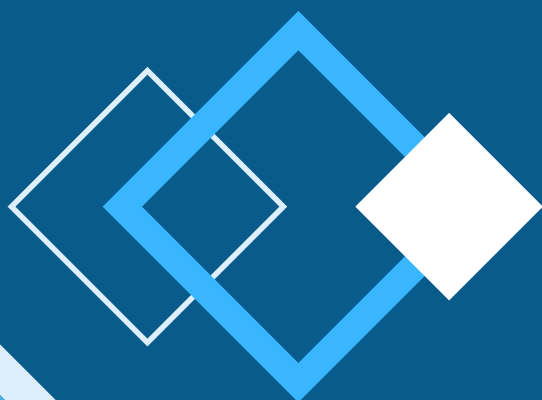
Savani Village: Lighting the Way Home

A Mother's Fight — Samoon Extends a Hand to Sunita Pawar

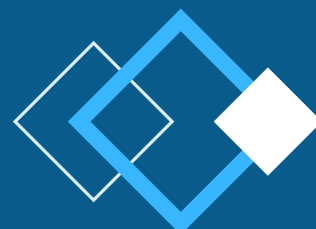

Without pause, the Foundation gave him warmth and mobilized help. Volunteer Gajendra Rana led urgent efforts to get him medical attention—but his treatment now depends on public support.

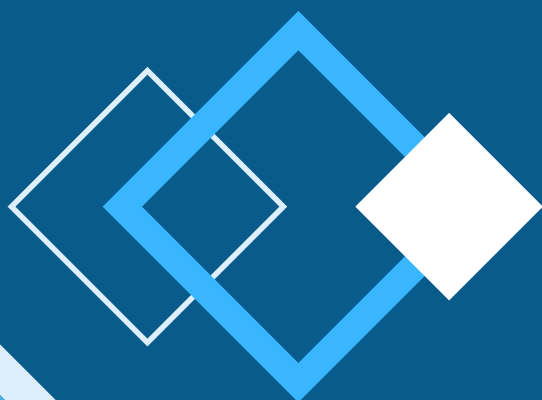

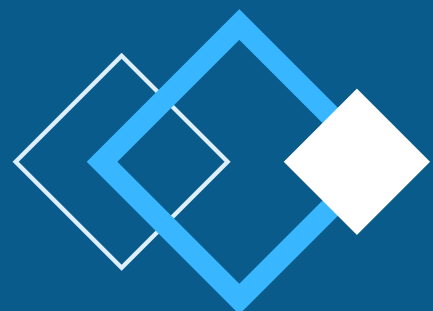
Guided by Center Director Vijendra Kumar, students planted saplings with enthusiasm, turning the festival into an act of environmental stewardship.
